MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE RE-CONSTITUTED SELECTION COMMITTEE FOR COMPASSIONATE APPOINTMENT FOR RECRUITMENT YEARS 2022 & 2023

The Selection Committee (hereinafter "the Committee") was originally constituted vide this office letter No. PCCIT/WB&S/Pers/284/Comp Appt/2023-24/8738-8743 dated 08.09.2023 and subsequent order No. 437 dated 04.03.2024, for Recruitment of eligible candidates on Compassionate ground to the posts of Tax assistants and Multi Tasking Staffs against vacancies in respect of the Recruitment Years 2022 & 2023. There were total 269 applicants for the Compassionate Appointment. After conducting 5 meetings, the Committee recommended 65 eligible graduate applicants for the post of Tax Assistant and recommended 188 eligible applicants for the post of Multi Tasking Staff with a request to the competent authority to conduct necessary Data Entry Speed Test as per existing norms before final selection.


2. Vide order No 225 dated 14.08.2025 the Selection Committee (hereinafter "the Re-constituted Committee") for compassionate appointments against the vacancies in respect of the Recruitment Years 2022 and 2023 has been re-constituted with the prior approval by the Ld. - 3. At the outset, the Re-constituted Committee noted the following facts which are the reasons for re-constitution of the committee:
 - A. Vide resolution No. 4 of Minutes of Meeting dated 25.04.2024 (Annexure 'A') the Committee recommended that, "in cases of appointments of candidates with below minimum educational qualification (other than widows of deceased Govt. servants), prior permission may be taken from the Ld. Revenue Secretary before issuance of offer of appointment as per para 6.B.(b) of the 'Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment' (Annexure 'B').
 - B. Subsequently, 26 candidates were shortlisted for the post of Multi Tasking Staff from the candidates recommended by the committee as per merit list. Out of these there were 4 candidates namely:



- C. In para 6.B.(b) of the 'Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment' circulated vide the CBDT, New Delhi letter F. No. A-12012/40/2022-Ad.VII dated 23.09.2022 it is stated that: 'In exceptional circumstances Government may consider recruiting persons not immediately meeting the minimum educational standards.In the case of an attached / subordinate office, the Secretary in the concerned administrative Ministry/Department shall be the competent authority for this purpose." However, the exceptional circumstances have not been mentioned in the committee's recommendation. The same have to be identified and incorporated in the recommendation of the Re-constituted Committee.

Accordingly, after receipt of the necessary report, the case was referred to the Board for necessary approval by the Hon'ble Revenue Secretary (Annexure 'E'). The Board vide its letter F. No. A-12012/03/2025-Ad.VII dated 08.08.2025 (Annexure 'F') has returned the case alongwith the following observations:

- E. In view of the above, the Board intimated to re-examine the proposal in terms of Master Circular on the Scheme of Compassionate Appointment circulated by DoPT vide their O.M. dated 02.08.2022 which also contains important/applicable Supreme Court Judgement/rulings on the subject matter of appointment on compassionate grounds. Thereafter, the proposal complete in all respect may be referred to the Board with the specific recommendations of Pr. CCIT, West Bengal & Sikkim fulfilling the relevant/applicable conditions.
- F. In para 12 of the 'Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment' circulated vide the CBDT, New Delhi letter F. No. A-12012/40/2022-Ad.VII dated 23.09.2022 it is stated that: 'Cases of missing Government servants are also covered under the scheme for compassionate appointment subject to the following conditions:

- (a) A request to grant the benefit of compassionate appointment can be considered only after a lapse of at least 2 years from the date from which Government servant has been missing, provided that:
 - (i) as FIR to this effect has been lodged with the Police.
 - (ii) the missing person is not traceable, and
 - (iii) the competent authority feels that the case is genuine.
- (b) These benefits will not be applicable to the case of a Government servant:
 - (i) Who had less than two years to retire on the date from which he has been missing; or
 - (ii) who is suspected to have committed fraud, or suspected to have joined any terrorist organization or suspected to have gone abroad.
- (c) Compassionate appointment in the case of a missing Government servant also would not be a matter of right as in the case of others and it will be subject to fulfillment of all the conditions, including the availability of vacancy, laid down for such appointment under the scheme;
- (d) While considering such a request, the results of the Police investigation should also be taken into account: and
- (e) A decision on any such request for compassionate appointment should be taken only at the level of the Secretary of the Ministry/Department concerned.'

A specific finding on each of these points needs to be incorporated in the recommendation of the Re-constituted Committee.

In view of para 12(d) of the 'Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment' the committee vide resolution No 3.d) of Minutes of its Meeting dated 05.03.2024 (Annexure 'K') recommended that, "a fresh Police investigation report may be gathered from the concerned police authorities before recommending the name for approval of the Hon'ble Revenue Secretary". Accordingly, fresh police investigation report was sought (Annexure 'R'). Therefore, as per para 12 of Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment' the following points were fulfilled in this case:

(a) A request to grant the benefit of compassionate appointment can be considered only after a lapse of at least 2 years from the date from which Government servant has been missing, provided that:

In pursuant to the board vide its letter F. No. 12012/06/2023-Ad.VII dated 06.02.2023 (Annexure 'I') a fresh Inspector Inquiry Report was sought before referring the case to the Board.

In this case the Board has observed the following points vide letter F. No. A-12012/03/2025-Ad.VII dated 08.08.2025 (Annexure 'F'):

Observation: As per Recruitment Rules, age limit for appointment to the applied post (Multi-Tasking Staff) is 18-25 years

In this regard, the Committee observed that para 6.B (a) of *Master Circular on Scheme of Compassionate Appointment'* it is stated that:

"Upper age limit could be relaxed wherever found to be necessary.........

Note II: Authority competent to take a final decision for making compassionate appointment in a case shall be competent to grant relaxation of upper age limit also for making such appointment."

In this regard, the Committee vide resolution No 5 of Minutes of its Meeting dated 25.04.2024 (Annexure 'A') recommended that: 'the competent authority may consider the same wherever required, before recruitment of the applicants on compassionate grounds.' As the Hon'ble Revenue Secretary is the competent authority to accord approval for appointment in this case, he also may grant necessary age relaxation.

Observation: As per Inspector's Report, details of income of the applicant (other than family pension) at SI. No. 10 shown as a second per annum, but in column 4 of 100 point formula report, the Departmental Screening Committee (DSC) shown NIL income and allowed points to the applicant instead (Committee) oints.

The Re-constituted Committee perused the Inspector Report dated 03.02.2025 (Annexure 'V') where it is revealed that annual income of which is eligible for 8 points. Vide affidavit dated the applicant claimed that he is and accordingly, the Committee awards oints against para No 4) Annual income of earning members and income from property (movable/immovable) of Scheme for compassionate appointment-100 Point Formula for assessment of applications for appointment on compassionate grounds' with total score of 41 points.

In view of the above, the Re-constituted Committee decided that in case of may be awarded **08** points for annual income of against para No 4).

Therefore, the Re-constituted Committee recommends that nay be awarded with 39 points instead of 41. Based on this revised point the Reconstituted Committee also recommends that the position o in the merit list of Multi Tasking Staff is revised from Sl. No. 27 to Sl. No. 34 as per the rules and criteria followed by the Committee. For selecting eligible candidates for the post of Multi Tasking Staff having 26 vacancies, the eligibility list of the candidates went upto SI. No. 27 as the candidate at SI. No. 13 was selected for the post of Tax Assistant. As the case of doesn't qualify for recommendation, the Re-constituted Committee also recommends that No 06/2011-12) whose name appears in the Sl. No. 27 of the revised merit list (Annexure 'O') for the post of Multi Tasking Staff, may be shortlisted for appointment on Compassionate ground against the vacancy of Recruitment Year 2023 for the post of Multi Tasking Staff.
